

Intern Profile

The successful candidates will be postgraduate students (essential) in a relevant discipline (Marine Biology, Marine Environment, Aquaculture, Animal Care,) currently studying for a higher degree qualification (MSc, PhD or equivalent). This internship will form part of your studies, under the supervision of a tutor at your College/University. You will work on a specific research topic, mutually agreed in advance and aligned with our conservation programmes.

In addition, the successful candidate will:

- demonstrate a passion for marine life and the desire to preserve and protect it.
- be a confident swimmer with experience of the ocean; SCUBA certification preferred.
- be a physically fit non-smoker, able to carry 20kg weight and work long hours in the lagoon unsupervised.
- have a good standard of spoken and written English, with a sociable and outgoing personality.
- respect the high standards of an international 5-star resort, and be comfortable in guest-facing roles.

Intern Role

Duties may include but are not limited to:

Coral Propagation – Collection of coral fragments, transplantation of the frame, maintenance and photography of existing frames. Interaction with guests and local children to educate about coral reefs.

Turtle Conservation – Assist with turtle feeding and care of sick animals; clean pools and monitor health/growth.

Guest Excursions – Marine life presentations and guided snorkel safaris; increase awareness of marine biology and conservation in the Maldives.

Fish Hatchery (where appropriate) – Assist in our Fish Lab including tank cleaning, fish feeding, larval rearing.

Personal Project – Develop your personal project, ideally under supervision from your college/university. Prepare monthly illustrated progress reports (for our website), and present your project findings before departure.

Intern Benefits

No salary is given during this internship, and you will fund your international flights to/from the Maldives.

The following are included in the Intern Package:

- Return transfers between the resort and Malé.
- Shared accommodation with other same-sex resort staff members.
- 3 meals per day + tea breaks; working hours are 09:00 - 18:00 (with occasional late evenings).
- Seamarc uniform (including polo T-shirt, shorts and board shorts).
- 1 day off per week (with complementary excursion when available).
