

Marine Biology Internship

We are looking for postgraduate students (essential) in a relevant discipline (Marine Biology, Marine Environment, Aquaculture, Animal Care, etc) looking for work experience in the field, and perhaps studying for a higher degree qualification (optional).

Intern Role

Duties may include but are not limited to:

- **Coral Propagation** – collection of coral fragments, transplantation of the frame, maintenance and photography of existing frames. Interaction with guests and local children to educate about coral reefs.
- **Turtle Conservation** – assist with turtle feeding, pool cleaning, monitoring and care.
- **Guest Excursions** – give presentations on marine life, conservation awareness and guided snorkel safaris.
- **Fish Hatchery** (where appropriate) – assist in our Fish Lab, including tank cleaning, fish feeding, rearing.
- **Reports** – write 2-3 illustrated reports (in English) of your work experiences, for publication on our website.
- **Project** - if you are currently studying for a higher degree (MSc, PhD or equivalent) you may submit a research project proposal (optional) and use some of your time to work on research and data collection.

Intern Specification

- Post-graduate (essential) in Marine Biology, Marine Environment, Aquaculture, Animal Care, or similar.
- Studying or enrolled for a higher degree qualification (optional).
- Passionate for marine life and conservation.
- Confident ocean swimmer; SCUBA certification preferred.
- Physically fit non-smoker, able to carry 20kg weight and work long hours in the lagoon.
- Sociable personality, with a good standard of spoken & written English.
- Respectful of the high standards of an international 5-star resort, and comfortable in guest-facing roles.
